FCA NEWS

Executive Director Josh Slocum has been urging the Federal Trade Commission to update its Funeral Rule. The rule specifies the information funeral homes must put in their General Price Lists. The Rule was last updated in 1994. The FTC recently posted questions about updates, soliciting public comments by April 14, 2020. Item 21 asked: "Should all funeral providers be required to post their itemized GPLs, CPLs or OBCPLs online? Why or why not?" Slocum has noted that more and more people have embraced the digital age to find information and make purchases online. It is time for GPLs to be online as well.

The Ohio Board of Embalmers and Funeral Directors

The Ohio Board of Embalmers and Funeral Directors inspects, handles complaints and writes rules pertaining to legislation for cremation facilities and funeral homes. It has the authority to levy fines and close facilities.

On October 1, 2017, The Preneed Recovery Fund was established. Funeral homes pay the Board \$10 for every preneed funeral contract sold. Families that purchase a preneed contract are reimbursed if a funeral home misuses the payment for a prepaid plan. Presently, the Preneed Fund has a balance of slightly less than \$500,000. On January 2020, the Board approved its first payment to a bereaved family.

At the March 18, 2020, meeting, the Board approved three more preneed payments and tabled two. (It appears there are still some bad actors out there in the funeral industry.)

Also, David Ingram resigned as Executive Director of this Board, effective 12/27/2019. I believe he did an exceptional job. He was replaced by Cheryl Grossman, effective 12/29/2019. Ms. Grossman represented the 23rd Ohio House District from 2009 to 2016 and served as a councilwoman and mayor of Grove City.

Lastly, the President of the Board, William Wappner, mentioned recent legislation in Washington State about that state's approval of deceased body composting and alkaline hydrolysis He indicated there were problems with this legislation. The Board took no action.
